

There are thousands of resources on management and leadership. Here are some brief comments on different methods for identifying and using these resources. If you can't decide where to start, we recommend you start with the highest rated resources on the "other resources" tab of this spreadsheet.

Online courses	There are numerous online courses available that focus on management and leadership.	Sometimes these come with knowledge tests and other techniques that aid recall of the learned information. Many courses are free.	Lots of people start but never finish online courses. Blinkist	Subscription service that provides ~15 minute summaries of popular books on various topics. There are around 250 titles in the "management and leadership" section.	Available in both audio and written format. Good way to cover lots of "ideas" and perspectives in a short period of time. Can adjust narration speed.	The summaries might miss out some of the most important content, such as detailed practical guides and diagrams or important studies, research, and empirical evidence that leads you to update your views. Google searches	Search engine.	Returns all types of content.	It's hard to sort through results without checking everything. Results are based on algorithms that aren't necessarily well-matched to your needs.	https://www.google.com/
Google Scholar searches	Search engine for academic content, including both books and articles.	Narrows the search to academic research. You can use citation counts as a rough guideline of how widely-recommended a research item is by other researchers. Some content is available for free.	Some content can be stuck behind paywalls. Popular books	There are literally hundreds of books written about leadership and management by experienced practitioners or by researchers that are intended to be widely purchased and read. Sometimes these books rely on the experience and intuitions of the authors and sometimes they focus a little more on summarising relevant evidence from psychology and other research fields.	These books may be focused on real-world contexts and practical tips. Full books will likely contain more detail and examples than short summaries, like on Blinkist. If you buy a book, you can highlight and write notes directly onto the book.	The intuitions of experienced practitioners can conflict with each other; if so, it's hard to know which advice to trust. Some tips and tricks might be highly context-specific, so popular books might not provide much reason to expect that these behaviours will work in your context -- only thorough research can evaluate which behaviours are most effective on average. Podcasts	Podcasts vary in format, from in-depth interviews with guests to short, to monologues, to highly-edited episodes. If you can subscribe to a relevant and useful podcast, this could be a useful regular reminder to keep consciously developing your leadership and management skills. Can adjust narration speed.	May be less detailed than books. Some podcasts may only be partly relevant, so it might be harder to specifically target skills and issues that you would like to focus on.
